- (j) all USAR INSARAG External Reclassification work, NZMAT work and EMAT work (other than responding to emergency incidents).

# All union members on Red, Brown, Blue, Green or Yellow Watch (other than those employed in the Northern, Central and Southern Communications Centres)

- (b) all work other than rostering, undertaking PCAs, responding to emergency incidents and restoring appliances to operational readiness

## All union members on Black Watch

### Northern Central and Southern Communications Centre members

- a) advising Ambulance that FENZ has arrived at a medical response job
