Auckland based personnel:

- From 11.59pm on Sunday 14 February 2021 follow the Service Delivery Preventative Protection Protocols (SDPPP) for Alert Level 3.
- Please ensure all personnel are aware of this change and to follow the correct SDPPP.

- From 11.59pm on Sunday 14 February 2021 follow the <u>SDPPP for Alert Level</u>

- Please ensure all personnel are aware of this change and to follow the correct SDPPP.

Situation

- Today the Government has announced that there are three new community cases of COVID-19 in Auckland.
- As a result, Auckland will move from Alert Level 1 to Alert Level 3 from 11.59pm on Sunday 14 February 2021.
- Auckland based personnel are to follow the <u>SDPPP for Alert Level 3</u> from 11.59pm on 14 February 2021.
- All other areas of the country will move from Alert Level 1 to Alert Level 2 from 11.59pm on 14 February 2021 and should follow the <u>SDPPP for Alert Level 2</u>.
- Our Service Delivery Coordination Centre and the Region teams will continue to plan for how Service Delivery will operate at all alert levels and how we will transition between these allowing for regional variances as required.

High risk personnel under Alert Level 3

- Those with current underlying medical conditions will need to complete the Fire and Emergency <u>medical assessment</u> to assess and confirm if the person can remain on, or return to, operational duty.
- Those with high risk household members can continue to work but should follow <u>MoH guidelines</u> on how families and households can stay safe. Please discuss any specific circumstances with your manager.
